county	The division of country into territories.
country	A nation with its own government.
village	A group of houses smaller than a town, situated in a rural area.
town	A built-up area with a name, that is larger than a village and generally smaller than a city.
city	Any town in the UK which has a cathedral.
coastal	Near the sea.
map	A picture representation of an area of land or sea showing physical features, cities, roads, etc
atlas	A book of maps or charts.
settlement	A place, typically one which has previously been un-lived in.
urban	The characteristic of a town or city.
rural	The characteristic of the countryside.
environment	The natural world, as a whole or in a particular geographical area, especially as affected by human activity
population	How many people live in a particular place.

Facts about London and St Ives

- The population of London is 8.982 million.
- London Has 170 Museums.
- London has derived from the old Celtic word "Londinous" which means to be bold.
- The population of St Ives is 9,616.
- 6 best galleries and museums in St Ives
- St Ives takes its name from St Ia, the daughter of an Irish chieftain, who is said to have sailed to Cornwall on a leaf, having missed the boat carrying other saints.

Key Dates

- 1640 -Richard Hext became the first Mayor of St Ives.
- 1666 - The Great Fire of London
- 1710 -St Paul's Cathedral completed
- 1863 -First underground railway opens
- 1877 -The railway arrived in St Ives, with the opening of the St Ives Bay branch line from St Erth.
- 1897 -Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee
- 1940 -The Blitz begins. 6 bombs were dropped on St Ives during World War 2 and about 9,000 were dropped on London.
- 1993 -A branch of the Tate Gallery, the Tate St Ives, opened.
- 2012 - Olympic and Paralympic Games
